God: Don't be afraid, I am with you.



4. Joseph: God Turns Evil into good

Bible Study: Genesis 33 - 50

Joseph was Jacob's 11th son and the first son of Rachel. Jacob loved Joseph more than his 10 older brothers. They were very jealous. They hated Joseph. Joseph (~17) dreamed his brothers' sheaves bowed down before his. He told his brothers. They wanted to kill him.

One day, they met some traders going to Egypt. They sold Joseph to the traders. In Egypt, he was sold to Potiphar. Potiphar was the leader of the king's bodyguard. YHWH was with Joseph. He blessed Potiphar because of Joseph. Joseph did a good job. He became the chief slave.

Potiphar's wife saw that Joseph was very well-built. She said, "Fuck

me!" Joseph replied: "Your husband trusts me. How can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" Day after day she asked. Joseph stayed away from her. One day, she tried to rape Joseph. Joseph ran away leaving his coat. When her husband arrived home, she accused Joseph of trying to rape her! Joseph went to jail.

YHWH was with Joseph. The jailer put Joseph in charge of the other prisoners. The king's baker and cup bearer were sent to prison. They had dreams. Joseph interpreted their dreams. Joseph asked the cup bearer to help get him out of prison but he forgot. Three days later, everything occurred as Joseph said.

Two years later the king had 2 dreams which no one could interpret. The cup bearer told the king about Joseph. The king asked Joseph to interpret the dreams. Joseph replied: "Not I, but God. 5. Moses: God sets captives free

Music: "Horse and rider Song"

Bible Study: Exodus 1 - 15

400 hundred years passed. There were many Hebrews. The new king was worried. He made them work very hard. He ordered: "Kill all baby boys."

One mother hid her baby in a basket in a river. The king's daughter saw and adopted him. She named him Moses. As a young man, he saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew. He killed the Egyptian. He fled to the desert. He became a shepherd.

Moses (摩西) adopt (領養) Hebrew (希伯來) beat (摔打) suffer (遭受) misgivings (擔憂) magician (術士) plague (瘟疫) gnats (虱子) boils (瘡) miracle (神蹟)

When Moses was ~80 years old, the angel of YHWH appeared to him in a burning bush: "I have seen the suffering of my people and heard their cry. I have come down to deliver them from the hand of the Egyptians. I have decided to send you to bring them out of Egypt."

Despite misgivings, Moses went to Egypt. He told the Israelite leaders and the king of Egypt God's message. The king refused to let the Israelites leave. He made the people work harder. Moses asked the king many times. Each time he did a miracle. For example, the 2nd time, his staff turned into a snake. (The king's magicians did the same.) The 3rd time, he turned water into blood. (The king's magicians did the same.) The 4th time, frogs covered the land. (The king's magicians did the same.) The king promised: "If YHWH removes the frogs, the people can go." However, once the frogs were gone, the king changed his mind.

The 5th time, gnats covered the land. (The king's magicians could not do the same.) They told the king: "This is the finger of God." The king refused to listen. YHWH sent plagues of flies, death to cattle, boils, hail, locusts on the Egyptians but not the Israelites. Although, the king often promised to let the people go, when each plague ended he changed his mind.

YHWH told Moses to tell the people: "Take a lamb and kill it. Put its blood on the top and sides of the door. At midnight, the first born of every house whose door is not painted will die." YHWH did as he said. The king's son died. The Egyptians demanded the king allow the people to leave. YHWH said: "Do this every year to remember the passover."

A few days later, the king changed his mind and took his army to capture the Israelites. YHWH caused the Red Sea to open up and the Israelites walked across. When the Egyptian army tried to follow, the water returned to its place drowning the Egyptian soldiers.

7. Fruits of rebellion: Forty years in the desert

Music: "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing"

Bible:

Exodus 15-18: God was with the Israelites. They walked 3 days

through the desert. They had no water. They found some water but it was bitter. The people complained. Moses prayed to YHWH. YHWH made the water drinkable. 30 days later, they complained: "We wish we had died in Egypt. We are going to die of hunger." YHWH gave them bread. (He rained bread (manna) from heaven every morning (except on the Sabbath) for 40 years.) Shortly afterwards the people complained: "Give us water." God gave them water. The Israelites were attacked by an enemy. When Moses held up his hands (in prayer) the Israelites were winning. When he did not, the enemy was winning. The Israelites won.

Exodus 19: In the 3rd month of traveling, the people arrived at Mount Sinai. YHWH told the Israelites through Moses, "If you obey my voice, then you will be a special people." The people said, "We will obey." Moses gave the answer to God. God told the people how to prepare to meet him. Three days later God came down to the mountain top. The people went to the foot of the mountain. God called Moses . He gave Moses his commandments. Moses went down the mountain. He told the people. YHWH called Moses back up the mountain. He gave him more laws.

<u>Exodus 32:</u> The people saw that Moses was delayed. They made a calf out of gold. They worshiped it. They got drunk and acted immorally. YHWH was angry. He told Moses: "I will destroy the people." Moses begged God not to destroy the people. God repented. Moses went down the mountain. The scene was chaotic. Finally he regained control. Many people died.

Numbers 21: God was with the people. He gave them victory over their enemies. But the people spoke against God and Moses: "We hate this life. We don't like the bread God gives us.". God was angry. YHWH sent poisonous snakes. People died. The people said to Moses: "We have sinned. Help." Moses made a brass snake. He put it on a pole. Anyone who looked up at the snake got better. Those who did not, died.

The Israelites arrived at Canaan. They sent 12 men to look at the land. Coming back, ten men said: "It is a wonderful land that YHWH has prepared. But the people living there are too strong. We will be killed." 2 spies, Joshua and Caleb, had faith. Caleb said: "We can take the land." The people decided to kill Joshua, Caleb and Moses. God intervened. He said: "All adults except Joshua and Caleb will die in the desert. Your children will enter the land."

8. Joshua: God leads into the Promised Land

Bible: Joshua

Joshua 1: 40 years had passed. Moses had died. Joshua was the new leader. The Israelites stood on the edge of Canaan. God spoke to Joshua: "Go over the Jordan river...Have not I commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; be not afraid, neither be dismayed: for YHWH your God is with you wherever you go."

Joshua immediately gave the order: "Prepare to cross the river in three days." The people promised to obey Joshua as Joshua obeyed God. Joshua sent 2 spies to look at the land. They stayed at an inn in Jericho run by Rahab*. The king tried to catch them. Rahab hid them. She told them: "Everyone is afraid of you. YHWH is with you. We have heard what YHWH did to the Egyptians. If you don't hurt my family, I will help you escape." The spies promised. Rahab helped them escape.

God stopped the Jordan river. The Israelites crossed the Jordan river. The Ark, symbolizing God's presence, went first. After crossing, the people circumsized themselves. The manna stopped. They marched to Jericho.


<u>Joshua 6</u>: God gave Joshua orders: "Walk around the city once per day for six days. The only sound should be trumpets blowing. On the seventh day, walk around seven times. On the seventh time around have the people shout." Joshua and the people obeyed. When the people shouted, the walls fell down. As ordered by God, everything in the city was destroyed. The burned the city down. The gold and silver were put in the treasury of the house of the LORD. Of the people, only Rahab and the people in her house survived the battle.

Joshua 9-11 The people of the land were afraid. The men of a city named Gibeon made peace with the Israelites. Other kings heard about this. They decided to destroy Gibeon. The Israelite army rushed to Gibeon. They destroyed the attacking army. For a long time after this, army after army attacked the Israelites. No one tried to make peace. Why? "It was GOD's idea that they all would stubbornly fight the Israelites so he could destroy them." In the end, Joshua took the whole region. The fighting ended. Joshua divided the land among the 12 tribes of Israel. He did everything that YHWH had told Moses to do.

The title expression was used in a testimony meeting, following an evangelistic crusade in Brockton, Massachusetts, by Dwight L. Moody. A young man stood to speak, and it soon became clear he knew little Christian doctrine. But he finished by saying, "I'm not quite sure but I'm going to trust, and I'm going to obey." 6. Come, Thou Fount of every Blessing

Words: Robertson (1748) Robinson's widowed mother sent him at age 14 to London, to learn the trade of barber and hair dresser. However, his master found he enjoyed reading more than work. Converted to Christ at age 17, Robinson became a Methodist minister. He later moved to the Baptist church and pastored in Cambridge, England. He wrote a number of hymns, as well as on the subject of theology. His later life was evidently not an easy one, judging from a well known story about his hymn "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing." One day, he encountered a woman who was studying a hymnal, and she asked how he liked the hymn she was humming. In tears, he replied, "Madam, I am the poor unhappy man who wrote that hymn many years ago, and I would give a thousand worlds, if I had them, to enjoy the feelings I had then." Music: John Wyeth (1813) As a boy, Wyeth was apprenticed to a printer. At age 21, he became the manager of a printing company in Santo Domingo, only to barely escape with his life in the insurrection there. In 1792, he returned to America, and settled in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, where he became involved in the publishing business and co-owned a newspaper (The Oracle of Dauphin). After only a year in Harrisburg, President George Washington appointed him postmaster; he lost his office five years later when President John Adams declared the position to be incompatible with involvement in newspapers. 


